

The 8th Indian Ocean Naval Symposium (IONS)
ESSAY COMPETITION 2023

PART ONE: GENERAL

1. **The IONS Essay Competition** is conducted annually.
2. **Eligibility:** The competition is open to all uniformed and civilian members of IONS member and observer Navies, regardless of rank/seniority. For member and observer countries to IONS that do not have a formally constituted 'Navy', the term 'Navy' means the principal agency responsible for maritime security.
3. **Conducting Authority:** The Conducting Authority for the 2023 Competition will be the chairman of IONS, Admiral ADOONG PAN-IAM, the Commander in Chief of the Royal Thai Navy.

Guidelines and Rules

4. **Security Classification:** The content of each essay is to be **UNCLASSIFIED**.
5. **Pseudonym:**
 - a. In order to preclude any apprehension of bias, the competitor's name, rank and nationality are **not** to appear on their essay; instead, a pseudonym of the author's choice is to be used.
 - b. The essay is **not** to contain any reference or indication of the author's name, rank or nationality.
 - c. **Only** the pseudonym is to appear on the top of the first page of the essay.
6. **Author's Certificate.** A signed Author's Certificate is to be submitted with each essay (proforma enclosed).
7. **Language.** Essays are to be submitted in **ENGLISH**.
8. **Format/Length.** Each essay is to be prepared on A4 or letter sized paper with a line spacing of 1.5, using Microsoft Word in Times New Roman font 12; and is to be between 5,000 – 6,000 words.
9. **Acknowledgements and References.** Entrants are to ensure that full acknowledgement to source material is provided by way of footnotes and a comprehensive bibliography, using accepted layout and standard referencing systems, which cite the authors, title, publishers, locations, dates and pages of any books, articles or other texts from which the material is derived.

Judging of Entries

10. **Judging Authorities.** The Royal Thai Navy IONS Secretariat (Agenda Committee) reserves absolute authority in regard to the judgment of this essay competition. The Secretariat will form an independent panel consisting of scholars and professionals to assess the papers.
11. **Judging Criteria.** Essays will be judged against the following criteria:
 - a. Originality 10%
 - b. Logical structuring 20%
 - c. Grammar and Linguistics 20%
 - d. Task Response 40%
 - e. Quotation, References and Bibliography 10%

Penalties

12. **Plagiarism.** Detection of any level of plagiarism will result in immediate disqualification from the competition and will be advised to the appropriate authority.
13. **Length.** A penalty of 10% will be applied to essays not conforming to the specified lengths.

Prizes

14. The Conducting Authority reserves the right not to award prizes if essays are assessed as not being to a suitable standard. For papers satisfying the rules of the competition, the following prizes will be awarded to the three best essays, provided there are at least three entries; otherwise, the quantum of the prize will be reduced according to the following information:

Copyright

15. Once submitted, essay copyright will automatically transfer to the Conducting Authority.

16. **Prize-winning Essays.** The copyright of all prize-winning essays will remain with the Conducting Authority.

17. **Non Prize-winning Essays.** Once Conducting Authority has announced/promulgated the list of prize-winning essays, the copyright of essays not selected for prizes will automatically transfer back to the respective authors.

Dissemination of Prize-winning Essays

18. The Conducting Authority will circulate the prize-winning essays to all IONS members and observers, by email and by posting them on the IONS website.

19. Any journal or magazine - other than those produced and/or published by the IONS Secretariat - that wishes to publish any given prize-winning essay is to seek written permission from the Conducting Authority.

PART TWO: GUIDELINES SPECIFIC FOR IONS ESSAY COMPETITION 2023

Topic

20. The topic for the 2023 Essay Competition is: “Blue Economy: Ways Forward for Sustainable Development of IONS Member states”. The Essay should address “Cooperation on MARSEC: Strengthening Maritime Security for Prosperous and Sustainable Blue Economy”

Submission of Essays

21. Entries to the 2023 competition should be submitted electronically in both PDF and Word document versions along with the Author’s Certificate and are to be emailed to the Royal Thai Navy IONS Secretariat via these two email addresses (ions2023th@navy.mi.th and ions.thailand@gmail.com), with ‘IONS Essay Competition 2023’ in the email subject line.

Last Date for Submission

22. Entries must be received by the IONS Secretariat by 31 July 2024. Essays received after this date will not be considered for the competition.

Results

23. The winners would be announced and awarded at IONS Symposium 2024.
